PROXIMITY TO TRANSPORTATION

Road

The Municipality of Port Hope is located on Highway 401 within five minutes of the eastern border of the Greater Toronto Area and within 4 to 12 hours drive of all the major industrial market centers in North America. There are 3 interchanges along the 401 exiting into Port Hope: Hwy 28 (links to Hwy 7), Hwy 2 and Wesleyville Road. Hwy 2 runs parallel to Hwy 401 from Toronto to Kingston. Hwy 401 is a minimum 6 lanes from Port Hope to Toronto.

BTS Network provides regular daily municipal bus services within the Municipality of Port Hope and to the neighboring town of Cobourg.

Rail

There is direct access to both CP and CN rail services within the Municipality. CN is the only railroad which crosses the continent both east-west and north-south, serving ports on the Atlantic, Pacific and Gulf Coasts. CP railway provides freight and transportation services to a 14,000-mile network in Canada and the United States. CP's mainline network serves major Canadian ports and cities from Montreal to Vancouver, and key centers in the U.S. Midwest and Northeast.

Via Rail provides regular weekday passenger and commuter train services to Toronto.

Port

The Port of Oshawa is located 50 kms west of Port Hope. This Port is linked to major Canadian and American cities through both highways and CN rail connections. The Port of Oshawa has waterway access to South Central Ontario, North Eastern United States and international ports via the St. Lawrence Seaway.

The Port Hope harbour is available for recreational boating use.

Air

The Municipality of Port Hope is located one hour from Lester B. Pearson International Airport in Toronto. The airport offers regular daily passenger and cargo services. The airport is served by 5 runways and 24-hour customs operations. Pearson International is Canada's busiest airport with more than 1,100 aircrafts arriving and departing daily.

Within 30 minutes are the Peterborough, Oshawa and Trenton Airports. All three handle cargo (Canadian Custom authorized) and chartered passenger services.
